



These rules incorporate those of the Mareeba District Rodeo Assn for Kerribee Park (*shown in italics*). Where the Rodeo rules differ from the BOG rules, the more onerous rule has been used.

NOTE regarding site water: *The tap water at Kerribee Park is channel water. There is filtered channel water available at the laundry and behind the competitors' toilets. Only containers, not caravan tanks, can be filled with the filtered water.*

To enjoy this muster in a safe and relaxed environment, the Bushtracker Owners Group (BOG) Inc. Committee seeks your cooperation in complying with the following: -

1. *The Rodeo Association accepts NO responsibility whatsoever for caravans, campers, motorhomes or vehicles and their contents whilst they remain at Kerribee Park.*
2. The maximum travel speed for vehicles moving about the site is 5 km/h. While this is a safety requirement, it also extends consideration to fellow Boggers by reducing dust and noise levels.
3. Wherever possible, walk on the side of designated roadways and on walkways as provided.
4. *All caravan drawbars must face the road. This is a safety requirement in case of fire.*
5. Keep your caravan, vehicle (when parked) and all camping accessories within the confines of the site allocated for your stay.
6. Generators will not be used at Mareeba, as all sites are powered.
7. Minimise the extent to which all hoses, power leads, etc present a trip or fall hazard by reducing their exposure to passing foot traffic and/or by clearly marking their position.
8. No holes are to be dug for any reason.
9. Grey water may be disposed on the ground. *No solids, such as kitchen scraps, are to be disposed on the ground. Please fix a sock/stocking/gauze or similar to the end of the grey water pipe to capture any solids, which are to be bagged and disposed in the rubbish bins.*
10. *Campers must not contaminate waterways, roadside gutters, stormwater drainage etc. Please utilise a bucket if required.*
11. Individual camp fires are NOT encouraged at the Mareeba Rodeo Site. Please take advantage of the happy hour fires for late night small group gatherings. Should you wish to have a site fire, *only small fires in off-ground fire pits are allowed.*
12. Gas BBQs are permitted, subject to the direction of the Local Fire Control Officer.
13. An "EVACUATION ASSEMBLY AREA" is indicated on the Muster Site Plan contained on the Muster website. A safety briefing will be held at the commencement of the muster to comply with BOG insurance requirements. All persons who have arrived at the Muster, present on site at the time of this briefing, are required to attend.
14. Pets are welcome however will not be permitted at any function where there is the distribution and consumption of food and drink. This includes Happy Hour gatherings. The exceptions are animals accredited under a law of a State or Territory that provides for the



accreditation of animals trained to assist a person with a disability to alleviate the effect of that disability. Dogs must be on a lead at all times *and under the strict control of the owner*. Owners are to pick up and dispose of pet droppings.

15. *The wild kangaroos and wallabies that graze at Kerribee Park must NOT be disturbed.*
16. Dispose of garbage, *suitably wrapped*, in the bins provided. Separately marked bins will be provided if there is recycling in place. *All campers agree to leave their camp site in a clean and tidy manner.*
17. All members are required to wear their BOG ID badge whilst on site. It is also desirable that they be worn whilst in nearby townships.
18. The emptying of toilet cassettes is NOT PERMITTED in toilets. Toilet cassettes are only to be emptied at the dump point as indicated on the site plan.
19. *Do not put wipes/nappies or and foreign objects in the dump point – Warnings and penalties will apply!*
20. *NO undue noise after 9pm and no visitors after 10pm.*
21. *Illegal drugs, offensive language and excessive use of alcohol will NOT be tolerated.*
22. *No drones are to be flown at Kerribee Park.*
23. If an injury is sustained whilst attending the Muster, please seek medical treatment if required. Minor issues can be treated by the First Aid Officer (location shown on the site plan. Also look for the First Aid flag) otherwise seek treatment for major issues by calling an ambulance (000) or attending the local Medical Centre (refer contacts list on the Muster website). As soon as feasible after the injury please notify a BOG Committee Member of the injury and complete an 'Incident Reporting Form' which is available from the Committee Office.
